## A MESSAGE FROM THE INCOMING EDITORS

When Bill raised the possibility of our becoming involved with the publication, we viewed the prospect with a mixture of sadness and excitement. It is a sad occasion because it is unfortunate to see Bill relinquish his steady hand over the development and growth of the Canadian Competition Policy Record. This publication has filled a need in the Canadian legal and economic community and Bill has nurtured it to the point where it is a valuable, objective, and timely commentator on competition policy matters in Canada.

On the other hand, it is exciting to think about the prospect of taking over the publication, particularly at this time when profound changes are underway in competition laws in Canada.

One of the hallmarks of the Competition Policy Record, in our view, has been its objectivity and timeliness. It is our intention to meet the same high standards established by Bill over the past six years.

We would expect to have additional members serve on the Board and will, of course, announce them as they become members.

We expect to keep the structure and content of the publication intact. We will continue to report on current developments in competition policy areas, whether enforcement matters under the Combines Act or in other regulatory arenas. In addition, we will continue the practice Bill has started of using the publication as a vehicle to encourage discussion of topical issues relevant to competition policy. A new feature will be a regular report on current developments in the U.S. antitrust area. Stuart Benson and his law firm will contribute that part of the publication.

We are very much looking forward to the challenge of publishing the Canadian Competition Policy Record. We are pleased that Bill has agreed to continue to offer his invaluable advice to us through the Editorial Advisory Board, and we certainly would encourage any comment or suggestions readers of the publication may have from time to time.
