**BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES OF MEMBERS OF THE EDITORIAL BOARD**

**Stuart E. Benson** is a member of Miller & Chevalier, Washington, D.C. He specializes in administrative and legislative issues in international trade and commercial law. He received his law degree from the University of California at Berkley. Mr. Benson is a former Deputy Assistant Secretary of Commerce for Trade Agreements and a former Deputy Assistant Legal Adviser for Economic and Business Affairs, U.S. Department of State. He has been a lecturer in law at the National Law Center, George Washington University.

**Yves Bériault** is a partner in the law firm McCarthy Tétrault in Montreal. He is a graduate of the University of Ottawa Law School. Mr. Bériault specializes in public law and in competition law in particular. He has been a lecturer in competition law at the Université de Montréal for many years and has written articles and co-authored books dealing with this area.
